From Our Minister

Dear friends,

Paul tells us, "as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on



love, which binds them all together in perfect unity" (Colossians 3:12-14).

Clothing ourselves is a two-part process. We *take off* our old clothes, our dirty, earthly clothes – clothes of sexual immorality, of greed and idolatry, of anger and malice, of slander and filthy language (Colossians 3:5-9). We take off the clothes that do not honour Christ, and this 'taking off' means putting it to death, 'murdering sin', for they have died with Christ. The puritan John Owen said, "Be killing sin or it will be killing you."

And then, having been raised with Christ, we *put on* new clothes. Clothes of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Clothes of forgiveness, love and unity. Ultimately, we're putting on Jesus's clothes, as we seek to become like Him.



Some self-effort is required here: we have to choose to 'clothe ourselves'. But it's not all down to us. Jesus – through the Holy Spirit – helps us. So, for example, we might struggle to forgive. I'm always reminded of Corrie ten Boom, who was sent to Ravensbrück Concentration Camp in the second world war for hiding Jews in her home. After Corrie had been released due to an

administrative error, and after the war had finished, she met one of the camp guards who had become a Christian.

The guard said that he knew God had forgiven him, and asked Corrie for her forgiveness. Corrie realised in that moment that she couldn't forgive – his cruelty, the evil he had done, was too much. But Corrie prayed in that moment, 'Lord Jesus, I can't forgive, but you can – help me.' And she felt God's supernatural forgiveness flow through her.

Similarly, we might find it hard to resist temptation, and fall into sin. We might struggle to control our tongues, or to be humble, or to have compassion on someone we really don't like – or who we may feel deserves what they're going through. But, if our hearts and minds are set on Jesus, we can always pray and be caught up in a greater vision, captivated by a greater beauty, overwhelmed by a greater love.

Let's pray for Christ to help clothe and renew us, remembering that He became like us so that we could become like Him.

Climate Resilient Microfinance Project Bangladesh



Approximately one year ago Christian Aid launched the Climate Resilient Microfinance project in Bangladesh. The project had big ambitions – it sought to tackle serious problems in the current way the microfinance sector operates in Bangladesh. In doing so, it aimed to better protect families who are most vulnerable to the devastating impacts of climate change.

The project took a whole system approach to addressing this challenge, looking at everything from the risk assessment process for microfinance loans, to providing training to communities on climate-resilient income generating activities, to investing in disaster preparedness measures such as food banks, livestock shelters, low interest crisis loans and an early warning system app, and strengthening linkages to government social protection schemes.

After a slow start due to changes in the core team, delays in key incountry stakeholder approvals and further discussion and realignment of project activities to ensure the best chance of achieving the project goals, the project is now firmly underway.

- So far, the project has reached almost 4,000 people directly, against a target of 7,900, so is well on track in terms of overall project reach
- Recommendations have been developed on how microfinance institutions can better promote resilience in the face of climate change,
 - and how they can promote women's equal access to resources and decision-making. As part of the recommendations, loan


application forms have been revised to better assess the resilience of proposed business activities to climate change.

- 10 climate-resilient demonstration plots have been established including homestead gardens, goat and pigeon rearing setups, and ginger cultivation plots. Community members will be able to attend training session and visit the demonstration plots so they can establish similar activities themselves to generate income
- 600 women have participated in training on agriculture, poultry and livestock farming. As a result, practice on climate resilient agriculture has increased which is supporting communities to adapt to climate risk. This training is being conducted in partnership with local Government to ensure sustainability
- Community committees have been established to increase awareness on gender-related issues including gender equality, dowry, early marriage, and divorce.
- Two meetings have been held with local leaders and government, with the aim of advocating for women representatives to be included in standing committees. As a result of the meetings, 15 women are now being included in two standing committees and 1323 women have been included in various government safety net programs, including Vulnerable Group Development, Vulnerable Group Feeding, Pregnancy allowance, a food for work programme and disability allowance

Christian Aid first worked in Bangladesh in 1972 after the Liberation War and today works with 17 partners in 20 of the most vulnerable districts of Bangladesh across the southern coastal region, northwest, and central flood and 'haor' (wetland) areas. Please give thanks to God for the work of Christian Aid and its partners in Bangladesh.

Please continue to pray for Bangladesh, its people and its government and leaders. Please pray that projects like this one can have a real impact in improving the lives of ordinary Bangladeshi people, giving them more protection against the devastation of climate change.


